

Geopathic Stress by David Moore

Geopathic Stress occurs where the natural vibration of the earth is disrupted. A common cause of this disruption is the flow of water through underground streams and rivers and through old drainage systems. Water is a good conductor of electricity. It also is good conductor of other energy forms. If it flows beneath an electrical transformer it can pick up and carry electromagnetic radiation. If it flows below areas where negative energy may be present such as old battle fields, burial areas, and the like, it can pick up and carry these energies, which then radiate outward as the water flows. This, in turn, can bring on or exacerbate a variety of ailments. We would not choose to live next to an electrical transformer station or the site of an ancient battle. These energies can be carried to a site via underground water.

Dowsing, using “L” rods, is a technique used to identify geopathic stress locations. The rods are a form of applied kinesiology, (along with muscle testing and use of a pendulum). If stress is identified at a location metal “pins” can be driven into the earth to remediate the stress. They act like reverse lightening rods to spin off the negative energy before it reaches a home or work place building. In the United Kingdom many architects would not start the design on construction of a new building without having the site check for geopathic stress. There, the Royal Engineers, (similar to our Army Corps of Engineers), test and license dowsing professionals. In 2012 I received training in the location and remediation of geopathic stress from a licensed, British dowser and since then have checked and remediate sites in nine states.
